



Home to some of Europe's most crowning cities and sights, the Alps are a lifeline bound by culture, cuisine, and music. In these majestic landscapes, a strong focus on wellness and environmentalism developed that was decades before its time. Updated for today's traveler, the eco-friendly vibe and health-conscious ethos are harmoniously au courant in chic restaurants, design-forward hotels, and luxury spas. These aren't your grand-mère's or grossvater's Alps. Here is a guide to some of today's most up-and-coming regions.

WHY GO NOW

Summed up in one word: Location. Sitting at the crossroads between three countries, the breathtaking vistas, modern architecture, and expansive lake make it an impressive mecca for the outdoors and cultural experiences.







On the banks of Lake Constance, Bregenz is the capital of Austria's westernmost province. For a panoramic view, ride the gondola up the Pfänder Mountain and look out over the lake and peaks to the Tirol border.

The annual Bregenzer Festspiele (bregenzerfest spiele.com) summer music festival is renowned for its lakeside open-air floating stage. Concerts are performed by the Vienna Symphony Orchestra and this year's opera is Verdi's Aida (July 22 - Aug. 22).

Designed by Swiss architect Peter Zumthor, the Kunsthaus Bregenz (kunsthaus-bregenz.at), or KUB, is an Austrian art force to be reckoned with: It has fostered such artists as British sculptor Antony Gormley, who will transform the region into



a stage for his landscape project Horizon Field this summer.

An Alpine connoisseur's delight, the Schubertiade (schubertiade.at) is the world's preeminent Schubert festival with about 70 events and over 30,000 visitors per year.

On the hilly outskirts of Bregenz, Hotel Deuring Schloessle (deuringschloessle.at) serves up highly regarded traditional recipes and international fare. Housed in a little castle, this unique dining experience combines history and elegance. Located in the picture-

perfect village of Schwarzenberg, the Gasthof Hirschen (hirschen schwarzenberg.at) is a historic landmark. The warm baroque atmosphere of this award-winning restaurant compliments the regional character.



STAY



At the base of Gebhard Mountain, Hotel Schwärzler (schwaerzler.s-hotels. com) is perfectly situated near the city center and offers convenient transportation. Its cozy ambiance features a garden terrace for al fresco dining, an indoor pool, steam room, and solarium. Built in the 19th century,

the impressive exterior of the Best Western Premier Hotel Weisses Kreuz; (stadtgasthaus.at) houses thoroughly modern interiors renovated in 2007. The individually furnished rooms come with flatscreen TVs, satellite channels, and sleek bathrooms.

WHY GO NOW

Swiss cities never fail to impress with their scope. These convenient gateways to the Alps strike a balance between big-city cultural sensations, innovative gastronomy, and natural wonder.





The Kunsthaus Zürich (kunsthaus.ch) art museum is celebrating its 100th anniversary. Pablo Picasso's first-ever museum retrospective was curated by the artist himself at the Kunsthaus in 1932. For the centennial, see the revival of this milestone exhibition. (Oct.-Jan. 2011).

This year, Geneva is

the first international capital of Circus World. Thousands of artists and circuses from around the globe will be in Geneva performing never-beforeseen programs.

In honor of the upcoming Summer Games, visit the Olympic Museum (olympic.org) in Lausanne, a center for looking back at athletic accomplishments, art, and culture.

Art museum meets refined dining at the legendary Kronenhalle Restaurant (kronenhalle.com) in Zürich. This famous spot is the place to go to see and be seen. As any local can tell you,



Zürcher geschnetzeltes tastes better sitting under a genuine Giacometti or Hodler.

In Geneva's old town. check out Au Pied-de-Cochon (pied-de-cochon.ch). The simple regional dishes made from local produce capture the best of authentic Swiss cuisine.

The historic Hotel Beau-Rivage Palace (brp.ch) in Lausanne first opened in 1861. Surrounded by magnificent parklands and views of the Alps, today it continues its legacy of traditional five-star resort service with amenities like the exclusive Cina

Mondes Spa.

Neighboring the city zoo, the restored art nouveau Sorell Hotel Zürichberg (zuerichberg.ch) is a four-star architectural gem offering breathtaking views of Lake Zurich and the Alps, a lookout over the city, and convenient access to the city center.



WHY GO NOW

In the umbra of Mont Blanc, French chic mingles with alpine tradition in this charming, yet elegant savoyard village and ski resort set in southeastern France's Haute-Savoie region.





Get a bird's eye view of the Mont Blanc area with a scenic sightseeing flight through Aérocime (aerocime.com).

Megève's potential as a luxurious mountain retreat was first recognized by the great 19th-century French banking family, the Rothschilds. They were instrumental in transforming the

alpine farming village into an exclusive enclave. The 18-hole Mont d'Arbois golf course (domainedu montdarbois.com) upholds their signature vision for sophistication amid natural beauty.


By car, take a day trip to nearby Lake Javen for picturesque hiking and quaint country dining. En route, stop at the Belle au Bois waterfall.

At Le Chalet du Mont d'Arbois (chalet-mont arbois.com), chef Olivier



Bardoux produces a menu that is in harmony with the changing seasons. For a denouement dessert, taste pastry chef Christophe Monrose's legendary soufflé following the traditional Rothschild recipe.

First opened in 1904, Le Chamois offers impeccable savoyard specialties, like fondue, pela, diots, and crozet, as well as a sunny summer terrace.

Hôtel Mont-Blanc

(hotelmontblanc.com) holds art de vivre as a way of life. Deemed by many as the crown jewel of Megève's hotels, it was nicknamed "Paris' 21st arrondissement" by the French writer Jean Cocteau, who frequented the hotel and left his mark with photos, drawings, paintings, and

a tea room he decorated in 1949. Among its other celebrity clientele were Brigitte Bardot, Charles Aznavour, Josephine Baker, Françoise Sagan, and others.

WHY GO NOW

Situated between Germany's highest peak, Zugspitze, and the world-famous Neuschwanstein Castle, Oberammergau is an under-the-radar Alpine find nurturing artistic enclaves just an hour south of Munich. The efficient and ultra modern Munich Airport is the ideal gateway to the Bavarian Alps







Once a decade since the 1600s, the residents of Oberammergau perform the Passion Play



(oberammergau-passion. com; May 15-Oct. 3) drawing nearly half a million. The spectacular performance lasts about five hours on an open-air stage.

Built in the 1870s, the extravagant Linderhof Palace (linderhof.de) has Baroque-style interiors and perfectly landscaped gardens and fountains.



Pick up fine liqueurs and beer brewed by the Benedictine monks at Ettal Abbey (kloster-ettal.de) founded some 700 years ago.

The arty region is typified by picturesque homes painted with Lüftlmalerei frescoes and talented woodcarvers. Many

wood sculptors continue to work in the village today and Pilatushaus is a good place to pick up a one-of-a-kind object.

The exquisite five-star Hotel Maximilian

(maximilian-oberammergau. de) in Oberammergau has two outstanding restaurants. The elegant **St. Benoît** is one of the region's best restaurants and a modern fine dining experience not to be missed.

The mountainous region is known for its holistic spa traditions



and focus on well-being. Savor organic fare at Ammergauer Maxbräu. This cozy restaurant features a fresh menu using local products and house-made Bavarian beer.

Located on Lake Staffelsee, the lovely **Hotel** Angerbraeu (angerbraeu. de) is a historic landmark

just 30 minutes north of Oberammergau. Murnau's spectacular natural beauty has fostered an artistic enclave including several noteworthy figures, such as Wassily Kandinsky and Gabriele Münter of the Blue Rider
